Dr. Hatice Sengul Erdem is a special educator with doctorate in Interdisciplinary Disability Studies from Trakya University, Edirne, Turkey. She holds a Master's degree in Special Education from Marmara University, Istanbul, Turkey and she has worked as school counselor for 15 years. She has published her research about teacher opinions on teaching reading and writing to intellectually impaired children, on games to develop social skills in children with autism, and on the perception of vocational high school teachers about inclusion.

In her doctoral research, she examined the characteristics of siblings of children on the autism spectrum. In this lecture, Dr. Erdem will speak about this research and about special education policies and practices in Turkey.
